## St George's Extended Churchyard

St George's Extended Churchyard (known locally as Pontesbury Cemetery) is the legal and financial responsibility of St George's Church. Our primary aim in managing the churchyard is to be a blessing to the wider community, essentially the parish. This aim encourages us to keep two things in view:

- 1) To provide a final resting place for the mortal remains of all residents of the parish who seek it. regardless of their historic involvement or lack of it with St George's Church
- 2) To maintain an environment that is pleasing to visit for all visitors

In our attempts to fulfil this aim, we have to keep in mind two heavy responsibilities. The cost of maintaining the churchyard falls exclusively on the church, with no assistance from any outside body. That cost, currently £5k, is shared between our members, although the benefits of the churchyard are shared with the whole community. There is some income in relation to occasional burials, but this falls a long way short of the annual bill for grass cutting etc.

Secondly, the rules and regulations that govern the churchyard are made by the Diocese and leave us with almost no flexibility as to what is permitted and what is not. Permission giving is delegated to the Rector, but the rules by which he is bound are very tightly defined. ## Flower Club

West Shropshire Flower Club member and demonstrator Penelope Harrison 'Nature's Bounty' showcased the wonder of the flower world. She started with a natural look, an arrangement within a willow structure of Magnolia branches to give outline, yellow chrysanthemum and orange tulips, then dressed with ivy for movement and fruit for shape variety. Her take on tropical paradise had wonderful flowing yellow calla lilies and bright gerberas within tropical foliage, dried tropical leaves were added which had been both platted and woven creating intricate forms (this led to the audience wanting to know how these were achieved and requests for a workshop to learn). The natural feel continued with a skeletal willow globe, which enclosed flowering daffodil and grape hyacinth bulbs pinned down and covered with moss. This created a really original and contemporary design which would make a dramatic table centrepiece. Penelope's next design interpreted water with a cascading design of blue lisianthus, statice and veronica with eucalyptus and ruscus through a midealino stick spiral. Continuing on the contemporary theme she went on to show a couple of quick foam free designs. Anemones and pussy willow in an elevated wired test tube ring and a collection of pots with sinuous wire bound bear-grass decorated with hypericum berries. In her final design she created a spectacular mass of multi headed white lilies surrounded by gorgeous large headed white roses and carnations.

and is the result of the many requests received to try and persuade drivers of all vehicles to slow down when passing in Shropshire in the future. through these rural villages, which all lie on the A488.

The funding means one ANPR camera will be placed on a Shropshire Council street-lighting column in each village, in locations that will benefit most from a reduction in speed.

Each camera uses the very latest in ANPR technology. Unlike conventional 'speed cameras' ANPR can record a vehicle's speed, number plate, time, date and photograph it. The software can also record offenders, who could be visited by the police. They can and will also be used to fight rural crime, and build an intelligence picture.

## **Notes from the Stiperstones**

Its always nice to write the first spring addition of Notes from the Hill, heralding the awakening of the hill's wildlife after the winter. The first curlews are back, and I can only assume that it was one of the chicks reared by Curlew County that dropped in the other day next to the office, as it arrived back calling to the exact location where the rearing pens were placed last year. Curlew Country are holding a sponsored walk across the Stiperstones on the 21st April to help raise funds for their work, see www. curlewcountry.org for more information.

The nesting birds are returning to the hill to set up their territories and that starts off our bird survey work. Bird surveys rely upon the territorial behaviour of birds at this time of year, particularly the males who announce their territorial rights by singing their hearts out. Us humans consider this delightful and write poems about the lovely song of the skylark or odes to nightingales, "blithe spirits...with unbodied joy". However, in reality, these birds are shouting warnings to others of their kind to stay away, or else!

Once the birds have found suitable nesting habitat, like the heathland of the nature reserve, they will mark out



an area in which they can find enough food to bring up a family of hungry chicks. This will often be done by finding suitable perches from which to sing from, for example the stonechat will find suitable vantage points on gorse bushes and small trees. However, some birds like meadow pipits and skylarks, that nest where there are no song perches, will find suitable spots from which to launch their aerial song flight. Skylarks

usually sing on their way up and then hover for ages above their chosen spot, while meadow pipits fly directly upwards and then sing while parachuting slowly back to the ground.

Other birds that will be nesting on the ground include red grouse, snipe and possibly curlew, while reed buntings, whitethroats, tree pipits, stonechat and whinchat will all nest, if not on the ground, close to it.

Birds that nest on the ground are extremely easily disturbed by dogs running loose, so when visiting the nature reserve please keep dogs on a lead and on the path. Once a bird is flushed off a nest its eggs or young chicks will often be targeted by predators such as crows, and even if not, if it is constantly disturbed it will usually abandon the nest. So, although the hill has open access, the best way for you to help the wildlife of the hill, is to keep to the public rights of way and ensure that your dog does too.

## **Funding for farmers** and landowners in the Shropshire Hills Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty

Launched last summer, the Farming in Protected Landscapes programme has so far awarded £176,529 to 14 projects in the Shropshire Hills AONB. The grants support one-off farming projects which deliver benefits to nature, climate, people and place.

The Shropshire Hills AONB Partnership is providing support and administering the programme locally. As we approach the second year of this 3-year funding programme, we are encouraging farmers and landowners in the Shropshire Hills to take a fresh look at the land they own or manage.

Are there areas that are difficult or expensive to farm? Could these spaces be better managed for wildlife? Are there areas suitable for 'slow the flow' measures which help with natural flood management? Could repairs help to conserve an historic site or monument, or are there opportunities to interpret a site of interest and/ or encourage appropriate public access?

We would love to see this funding used to deliver large nature, climate or access projects across a number of farms, and we are encouraging farmers and landowners to think beyond their boundaries. Example projects might be to work to restore an area of upland peatland and manage it extensively with cattle, or habitat creation and management for a specific threatened species.

Looking at your land in a different way can be a daunting task. A good starting point is to make sure you know what you already have in terms of good and potential wildlife habitat, historic monuments, or what public rights of way or watercourses cross your land? We can help with this, or you can access the information vourself on MAGIC maps, an online mapping tool, which highlights priority habitats, Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSIs), historic monuments etc

We will be holding a webinar in April to update farmers, landowners and land agents on the funding programme and answer questions - for more information on this please get in touch by emailing shropshirehillsaonb@ shropshire.gov.uk.
