

Top tips for using apps

• Avoid downloading fake apps by using only the official store for your device's operating system. Even then, read reviews and choose with care, as some rogue apps sometimes make their way into app stores.

• Read terms and conditions when downloading apps to understand aspects like data sharing and in app payments.

• Consider the permissions you grant for apps to access your location, photos, camera, contacts or other functions or data.

• Check app settings to determine whether downloading updates and dayto-day data are enabled automatically. If they are, it could make it easier for your data to be intercepted, and may use up your data allowance.

• Observe apps' minimum age ratings, which may vary from store to store. This is important for apps which may be accessed by children.

• Log out of apps – particularly those for banking, shopping or payments when you've finished using them. This also goes for location-based apps, when you want to protect your whereabouts.

 Always download app updates when prompted. As well as providing new features and better functionality, updates usually contain security fixes.

• Be aware of the data used by apps when you're out and about, including roaming charges abroad. And remember that some apps enable in app purchases, which can be very attractive to use especially to children - but at a price.

• Remove apps you haven't used for a while, apart from security apps. If you're disposing of your device by any means. erase all data and apps, also preferably doing a factory re-set.

DIAL 159. As publicised in national media, 159 is new emergency hotline has been launched for people to report and check financial scams as they happen.

159 has been set up by Banks and Telephone companies to fight fraud and, whilst it is still a pilot scheme, the majority of banks are now signed up to it. When should you call 159 ?

• When someone contacts you claiming they are from your bank

• You receive a call or email asking you to transfer money or make a payment

• You receive a call about any financial matter and it seems suspicious

A potential victim who dials 159 will be automatically connected to their bank's fraud prevention service, thus often saving a long wait on hold.

Anyone who receives a call or message from somebody claiming to be from a trusted organisation and who suggests money should be transferred is urged to hang up.

Then you should either wait for 10 minutes before ringing 159 to ensure the scammer has cleared the line or call immediately from another phone.

# JUST ONE THING.....to help save the planet

#### Tip No. 5 **Don't fill your kettle too full**

Consider how much water you actually need when filling the kettle. If you overfill when boiling the kettle to make a couple of cups of tea you are wasting electricity. It is complicated to work out but if you use double the amount of water needed to make 2 cups of tea then the extra electricity used could cost you at least an extra £ 47 per year [ref: Tameside MBC]. If you do boil too much water please use the excess- say for washing up, as leaving the boiled water there will cause limescale to form and make your kettle less efficient.

# Notes from the Stiperstones

I am surprised that I have seen so many bumblebees this year, as I don't feel like it has been a very warm year so far. Although the met office has stated that it was the fifth warmest May on record in the UK, I personally think it has been a cold spring on the hill this year.

Whatever the weather the bumblebees are very active. The Stiperstones is home to a number of bumble bee species, the heath bumblebee and the similar looking garden bumblebee, the larger buff-tailed bumblebee and the white-tailed bumblebee are also tricky to tell apart and the red-tailed bumblebee and the bilberry bumblebee both have orange red bottoms although the bilberry bumblebee has two lemon yellow stripes on its thorax, however even this can sometimes be confused with the early bumblebee.

> Undoubtably our special bumblebee on the hill is the bilberry or mountain bumblebee. This declining species is associated with upland sites with lots of bilberry, however it relies on other nectar sources later in the year and will use hay meadows and gardens from late May until the heather starts blooming. With experience the bilberry bumblebee is easily identified and ••• the Stepping Stones

project has started a volunteer led project to monitor this important indicator species for the health of the Shropshire Hills. If you would like to help out you can contact bumblebeesonthemynd@gmail who are running training courses, surveys and collating records for the Stiperstones and Long Mynd area.

In addition to the true bumblebees there are also a number of cuckoo bumblebees on the hill. These are a fascinating group of bees that have evolved alongside the better-known social bumblebees. Female cuckoo bumblebees emerge from their winter hibernation about six weeks after their hosts and often resemble them in colouring. However, in true 'Game of Thrones' style these females work their way into established bumblebee nests where they wait to get the scent of the nest before killing off the resident queen and taking her place. The female cuckoo bumblebee will then lay its own eggs which will be tended by the nests active worker bees until they hatch and fly off to do it all over again.
