#### **Library open!** We are delighted to announce that The Pavilion (Community Hub and Library) has opened and the key was officially handed to Duncan Eletcher chair

key was officially handed to Duncan Fletcher chair of Parish Council from Howard Thorne, Chairman of Shropshire Homes. A formal opening and community celebration will take place when Covid restrictions allow.

The library has now opened on reduced hours (see below) and with limited access. This will be reviewed on a regular basis and we look forward to the future when we can have all of the building fully functional, with lots of activities taking place.

The building has already proved to be a community asset, housing the local foodshare scheme temporarily, before its move to its present home at the Congregational Church. It has also provided a space for partnership working to launch the Rea Valley Good Neighbours Scheme and Pontesbury Feed the Birds (more about those on page 9). Although not yet back to full capacity the Library Service and Friends Of Pontesbury Library have continued to promote the benefits of reading and literacy with many library services provided online and a writing competition and upcoming village treasure hunt. We look forward to many more such initiatives and activities taking place in the building to support our local community in all aspects of their lives.

A big thank you to Shropshire Homes for the building and to Shropshire Library service, the Friends of Pontesbury Library and other members of the Pavilion Steering Group for all their support and hard work in getting the building to this stage. The Steering Group will continue to meet regularly to develop the building further. We are still looking for local members who would like to get involved, please contact the Parish Clerk if you would like to know more.

The difficulties faced by many people, particularly over the last six months has highlighted the need for a local network of support to enable people to remain healthy and independent & connected within their communities.

So we are pleased to announce the development of a brand new community project called

Community Good Neighbours, Pontesbury and Rea Valley, a team of local volunteers able to offer a helping hand within the community.

The aim of the service will be to link a volunteer with a person who may be in need of a Good Neighbour volunteer for: a friendly chat, a phonecall, doing small errands or support to stay active and connected within the community.

It is the combination of the existing Pontesbury Coco Befriending service joining together with the Volunteers Helping Neighbours group, who worked hard to provide a much-needed medicine and shopping collection service over the period of lockdown and shielding.

The service will follow all current Government guidelines for safety and will aim to be flexible and adaptive to any further lockdown restrictions.

We are currently in the process of recruiting and training the first group of volunteers and so hope to be able to commence the service later in September. Volunteers will be DBS checked and have initial training and ongoing support.

We will have a dedicated phone number for people enquiring about being linked with a volunteer **Tel: 07944 891953 Phone messages will be listened to Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 10 – 2** Equally if you are interested in volunteering for the scheme please leave a message.

We would like to say a Big 'Thank you' to all those existing volunteers of both teams, for their time, hard work, compassion and dedication at this unprecedented time of need. As volunteers you have provided essential support to local people who have found themselves alone or isolated, with health issues or even a change in circumstances. A friendly voice and a regular chat can make a real difference and has already made a positive impact on people's lives.

## Pontesbury Climate Emergency Action Group

The Pontesbury Climate Emergency Action Group is now up and running. Following on from the very productive community meeting hosted by the Centre for Sustainable Energy on 30 July the group held a zoom meeting on 25 August.

Several actions were agreed by those present which will focus on environmental concerns in the area of Pontesbury, and help towards reaching zero carbon for the Parish by 2030.

We want a greener, more sustainable parish for everyone. We hope to interest and engage as many people and organisations in the community as possible, to raise awareness of the effects of climate change and loss of biodiversity and to involve people in our projects.

Initially we are investigating the possibilities of tree planting, improving our grass verges, increasing safe cycle ways, increasing local recycling facilities, tackling the problem of litter, and finding ways to measure our progress towards a carbon neutral parish.

The offer is open to any Shropshire resident who has been bereaved by either a recent death or previous loss. The Bereavement Support Service is operated by Shropshire Council and community voluntary partners Samaritans, CRUSE, Severn Hospice and Crane Quality Counselling. The service can be accessed through self-referral by calling 0345 678 9028.

The Bereavement Support Service is accompanied by the launch of a grief and bereavement during COVID19 booklet which provides a compassionate overview of coping with loss, feelings that may be experienced, supporting others who are grieving and links to help and information. A secondary booklet provides a practical guide for the process following a death and what has changed due to the pandemic. #### NATURAL ENGLAND

#### Notes from the hill

Well it has been the strangest of years so far, but hopefully things are returning a bit more to normality on the Stiperstones. Natural England Staff are back on site as we are allowed to carry out 'non-essential' work, although I would argue that all of our work is essential to the management of the site. Our volunteers are starting back with us, where they can, and where we can ensure suitably socially distanced tasks. The obvious task being the scything of the bracken, as no one is likely to come within two metres if someone is wielding a scythe.

We are still seeing a lot of visitors to the reserve, it must be a record year for visitors, and the car park is generally busy these days, even on weekdays. Sometimes hidden away in the Secret Hills we forget what a busy island we live on. All the more reason to make more space for nature, and hopefully some of you will have seen BBC Countryfile explaining the vision of the Stepping Stones Project the other day.

You don't get much air-time on a short programme like Countryfile, so to update you a bit more fully, the main aim is to establish habitat links between and around the key wildlife sites of the Stiperstones and the Long Mynd, allowing wildlife to move across the area, and thus making it more resilient to climate and other changes that are happening now, and are likely to increase the threat to our wildlife in the future. The project is progressing despite the Covid lockdown with the start of volunteer activities, such as green hay collected from churchyards being spread on nearby verges. A bilberry bumblebee project started up and an appeal to purchase Cudwell Meadow, south of Church Stretton was launched. Verges are being managed for wildflowers and the Marches Meadow Group have purchased a snazzy new seed collector. There are also some exciting woodland and riverine projects in the pipeline. The dry weather on the hill has been good for insects, with good numbers of butterflies, moths and dragonflies. These have attracted a hobby that can often be seen hunting over the heather particularly at the top of the steep dingles on the West side of the hill. Hobbies are extremely agile falcons. They can sometimes be mistaken for peregrine falcons as they sometimes stoop after prey with closed wings. They both have pale cheeks and black moustaches, however they are smaller and thinner winged and are generally more agile in flight. They can often be seen catching insects on the wing and later when the martins and swallows are gathering will turn their attention to them. If you have the time it is worth sitting at the top of Mytton Dingle or Perkins Beach and watching the hobby, kestrel or ravens as they play in the updraft.

#### **Feed the Birds Project, Pontesbury and Minsterley** Shropshire Wildlife Trust's 'Feed the Birds Project' is aimed at sharing the joy of wildlife and connecting

Shropshire Wildlife Trust's 'Feed the Birds Project' is aimed at sharing the joy of wildlife and connecting people. The original scheme is aimed at training volunteers who are then matched with someone within their local community. Each week the volunteer will visit the beneficiary at their home, to chat about the garden wildlife, top up and clean feeders.

COVID19 put a stop to the visits until now but didn't stop the project! Here in Pontesbury and Minsterley we are working with Allcare, Pontesbury Primary School, Pontesbury Medical Practice and Cliffdale and have delivered bird feeders to vulnerable, isolated adults, and to local school children and families. We have asked everyone involved to send over pictures, drawings and letters of all the lovely birds and other wildlife they can see outside their windows or in their gardens. We plan to share the drawings and letters with the community, via social media and a newsletter, so everyone can experience the joy of wildlife and connect through their shared experiences.

# Important Consultation: Fire and Rescue Service

Shropshire Fire and Rescue Service is consulting on its draft Integrated Risk Management Plan (IRMP) 2021-25 and would welcome your views. Please go online to complete the survey and read the details. <u>https://www.shropshirefire.gov.uk/integrated-risk-management-plan-2021-2025-consultation</u>

The Plan sets out the changes the Service will make over the next four years under its key responsibilities including responding to emergencies, protection work with businesses and prevention activities to make communities safer. The consultation began on 6 July and will conclude 12 weeks later at 5pm on 30 September 2020.

The IRMP is effectively the Fire and Rescue Authority's contract with the community so it is vital that the views of the people who call 999, community partners and associates are listened to in moving from a draft Plan to the final version.

The IRMP contains information about communities, the risks they face and how the Service intends to manage and measure those risks. The Plan can be divided into three stages:

• Stage 1: Identifying and Assessing Risk; sets out what we believe the main risks are, and highlights some of the ways in which we've been dealing with them over the last few years.

• Stage 2: Managing and Reducing Risk; sets out what we are planning to do over the four-year term of the IRMP to tackle the risks we've identified.

• Stage 3: Measuring and Demonstrating Impact; sets out how we aim to show that our services and activities are having a positive impact on reducing risk.

The main proposals within the IRMP are:

• To make response timings easier to understand

• To explore how technology can be used to increase productivity in preventing fires in rural communities

- To increase activity in fire protection and regulation
- To assess how the Service can meet growing demand through the flexible use of resources, and

• To update the Service's Vision and Aims to will drive a culture of being more innovative, diverse, inclusive and developmental

A short questionnaire, which can be found in the draft IRMP and online, has been prepared to help to gather views. When the consultation is complete, the Service will have the fullest possible picture of risk across the county, a set of activities to manage those risks and a clear understanding of whether the Plan meets the expectations of the people of Shropshire. Your feedback will assist us in shaping the final IRMP, which will be published in April 2021.

## **Keep Shropshire Warm**

You may be eligible for free loft and cavity wall insulation or even free central heating!

Keep Shropshire Warm is a partnership between Shropshire Council and The Marches Energy Agency, promoting energy efficiency and energy conservation throughout the county.

Keep Shropshire Warm are particularly keen to hear from owner occupiers and private tenants who are off the mains gas network and have old, inefficient or broken boilers or heating systems.

Any householders who still require loft or cavity wall insulation should also qualify for funding and for the first time, old electric storage heaters are also eligible for upgrades.

Shropshire Council has widened the criteria for funding by taking part in the government's new ECO 'Flexible Eligibility' initiative, in the hope that more local householders will benefit.

Oliver Rothwell, Project Manager at Keep Shropshire Warm said: "This new criteria offers a great opportunity for residents in Shropshire to access financial help with heating replacements and insulation upgrades. I would encourage any households who are struggling with old and inefficient heating systems to call Keep Shropshire Warm without delay, even if you have previously been turned down for support."

Funding is available to households on a low income with household members who have a health condition, are over the age of 60 or have children under five living at the property. If you are on a low income and not in one of these categories, you may still qualify if you spend a lot of money on heating your home.

Please see the letter (*below*) that was delivered to a resident in Hanwood recently. I am sure this is a scam and once the person hands over money or bank details to receive the funds then they will be loosing money.

I write to you in good faith and utust that you will take a moment to consider the contents of this letter. I am Mr. Robert Danson, Head Auditor Citi Group Inc. Texas, USA, In the course of my lob, I discovered a floating fund in an account which was opened in 2002 by Late Mr. J. B. Booth, who doed in 2008. Every effort made to track any member of his family has since failed because the deceased died leaving no heir or a will in his file. I decided to contact you to stand as the next of kin since you share the same last name with him.

The motive behind this Letter is to facilitate the transfer of the sum of **USS8,600,000** (Eight Million Six Hundred Thousand United States Dollars) in the Investment Deposit to a safe account overseas.
