Tip No. 13Start Your Own Compost for the Garden

What do you do with your waste fruit and veg peelings, crushed egg shells,

loose tea leaves, ground coffee? Make your own small compost heap! Find a relatively shady, under-used corner of the garden, put together a structure to contain your heap and begin with a few twigs to aerate the pile. Add grass cuttings, dried leaves and shredded newspaper. Regularly turn them over and top up with decomposable items, but not meat and dairy products. [see 10 easy steps from Country Living]

I just wanted to drop you a quick message to thank everyone for your fantastic efforts collecting stamps to help Community Resource continue their work supporting people and communities facing difficulties. Your wonderful support has helped people in Shrewsbury by:

-Making sure that people living with a physical disability stay connected with those around them who share similar experiences, via the Shrewsbury Musketeers and Maidens Group, which get together every Wednesday to enjoy activities including exercise classes, pottery, art, quizzes, games, numerous cups of tea, chatting and lots of laughter!

-Ensuring continuation of the Shrewsbury Care and Share programme which offers essential support to people with dementia and the family members who care for them. The Shrewsbury group meets at St Peter's Hall in Monkmoor on the 2nd and 4th Friday of the month. The group offers mutual support and understanding in a safe and comfortable place with like-minded people. They offer respite care, as well as physical and mental stimulation for the Dementia sufferer, helping to boost their wellbeing.

-Enabling the continued provision of the Hearing Loss Support hub, for those adjusting to wearing a hearing aid, at Shrewsbury Library on the 3rd Tuesday of the month. Each attendee is provided with helpful information, any advice they may need, support, and practical help around the maintenance of their hearing aids. They can also be signposted to other services for more support that might be needed. - Assisting in the smooth running of the Shrewsbury Sight Loss Opportunity Group (SLOG), which meets at St. Chads Church Hall on the 4th Monday of every month (Feb to Nov). This group offers all kinds of interesting and adventurous activities to encourage people with sight loss to keep active, meet and make new friends, stay confident, and have some fun. They also allow people with varying degrees of sight loss to come together to share lived experiences and problems they have encountered. This helps people to overcome any difficulties they are facing, as they feel supported and listened to.

-helping to facilitate the running of the Sight Loss Cycling Group, which meets at Sundorne Sports Village on the 3rd Wednesday of the month, to bring together people with varying degrees to sight loss to experience cycling. The sessions are led by a qualified cycle coach, who has experience working with people with sight loss. There is access to a number of adapted bikes, as well as tandems and tricycles - a bike for everyone. During winter, when it's too cold to cycle they often go crown green bowling or meet at the village for a coffee and a chat.

Thank you once again for faithfully saving all your used stamps and taking them to the box in the Post Office. It is a very worthwhile thing to do. Keep up the good work. The stamps raise a lot of money for local charities. With thanks , *Sheila Crowther.*





Pontesbury & Rea Valley u3a invites both members and non-members to Meeting our next Open on 19th Wednesday April 2pm at Minsterley Parish Hall where Alison Utting will give a performance on the early life and personal experiences of the amazing Dame Agnus Hunt, or "Aggie" (31 Dec 1866 – 24 Jul 1948). Entrance is free and refreshments will be available.

Dame Agnes Hunt was a phenomenal woman. She established the practice of orthopaedic nursing and co-founded the world-renowned orthopaedic hospital at Oswestry. She also set up an award-winning specialist college to provide further education for students with special educational needs and disabilities.

Severely disabled herself, Agnes overcame huge obstacles in her mission to help others. Her indomitable personality and self-deprecating humour are woven through her remarkable autobiography, 'This Is My Life', which forms the basis of this 40-minute dramatic monologue written and presented by Alison Utting. The focus is Aggie's youth, training and personal life, rather than the history of the hospital and college.

This book, along with two other books about the history of the hospital - 'A Breath of Fresh Air' and 'Healing and Hope' - will be available for cash purchase at £10 if you wish. It is sold by the RJAH League of Friends and all proceeds will go to them.

"Home computing made easier" courses to be run at the Pavilion by Greg from Shropshire Technology

After many requests, ShropTech is pleased to announce a new series of courses to improve your knowledge and confidence in using computers and the internet. With so many changes and updates to computers and their software it is often confusing to spot the right box to click in all the pop-up messages.

Greg will show you how to detect and avoid electronic scams which are now becoming much more common and more sophisticated. We will look at managing your files and keeping them safe with different types of back-ups.

The course will be run at the Pavilion and will start on Tuesday 25th April and Thursday 27th April. Refreshments will be provided. Bring your own laptop or one can be provided for the sessions at no extra cost. To keep the sessions friendly and safe there is a maximum number of 8 people per session.

Beginners on Tuesday mornings 10.30-12pm Topics covered: computer security – antivirus/ antimalware programs, using email software / webmail, shopping online, word-processing, file management, backing up to a cloud, saving photos from a phone/tablet to a computer

Improvers on Thursday afternoons 1.30-3pm Will include: using additional antivirus/antimalware software to scan your computer and keep it in great order. Using spreadsheets to keep track of your finances and hobbies, editing photos and getting them ready to print – either online or taking them to a shop on a memory stick, solving connection issues with WiFi and printers and using web cams for video calling (zoom and teams)

Previously the courses have been run in recurring 8-week cycles with flexibility within each course to focus a little more on particular topics if the majority would like to. The courses are bookable in 4-week blocks at £80 per person for the 1st four sessions with an option to continue for the 2nd 4-week block.

NATURAL ENGLAND - Notes from the hill

We have been seeing frog spawn on the hill since February, and with the warm weather it was probably earlier than usual. The frogs obviously didn't see the sudden dump of snow coming in March.

Common frogs hibernate through the winter, usually on land underneath rotting logs or in a pile of stones, although sometimes they can lie dormant at the bottom of ponds.

They breed in ponds and ditches during the spring but spend much of the rest of the year feeding in damp habitats such as woodland, gardens, hedgerows and tussocky grassland. They can be found all over the hill, even though there aren't many ponds for them to spawn in. Once you do discover a pond it is usually



rammed full of their eggs lain in big clumps. This is very different from the toad that lays ribbons of spawn. At this time of year, they head to their spawning pools where they pair up so that the males can fertilise the eggs as they are produced by the female. Incredibly a female frog can lay as many as 4000 eggs in one spring. Once hatched the tadpoles take about 16 weeks to turn into little froglets that are ready to venture onto land.

A BEAUTIFUL SPRING WALK FROM CRUCKMEOLE

Distance 31/2 miles. Time 11/2 hours. Delightful footpaths, or green lanes, great views, plenty waymarks and kissing gates.

From Cruckmeole Old School turn left along pavement in direction of Hanwood for 50m. Cross main road to kissing gate and footpath sign. Go across field to stile. Cross railway line and climb gently ahead up field, following hedge to your left. Over stile, again follow hedge on your left and fence on right to reach another stile which accesses golf course. Continue ahead and gently uphill through trees and follow signs until reaching post with many footpath signs on golf course. [As a check, look left and you will be in line with stile on side of Pound Lane]. Turn right along golf course just beyond small fir tree. STOP 20m before stile for great panoramic view of the Parish and Breiddens. Over stile, turn 45 degrees right for 30m to reach far side of short line of hedgerow trees and follow downhill with trees on your left leading shortly to twisting path through rough grass and over stile in fence. Look ahead and aim across field on currently obvious path to gap left of small wood, where you turn right along field edge track to reach gate on right to enter lower golf course. Walk to left of small clump of trees on mound, through trees and bend left. In more open stretch go left of another mound and trees, reaching above a small pool where path bends right to follow on your left and below the old railway line. Exit golf course by gate and immediately left over railway bridge to follow lane through hamlet of Old Shorthill to reach main road.

With care cross over and follow left for short distance to first bend where turn right down lane which leads over Rea Brook, via footbridge and continue as lane bends left. Just before gate and driveway to house turn right uphill for short distance to kissing gate and follow left down wooden steps with handrail, turn right through floor of wood to kissing gate. Bear left over boggy depression, aim for isolated kissing gate in middle of field and then aim for kissing gate near Rea Brook which is at left end of fence marking field boundary. Through gate go diagonally across field aiming for left side of long low metal farm building. Go through kissing gate and turn right along lovely green lane. At top look back for splendid view. Through 2 kissing gates ahead go up field aiming for kissing gate to left of line of hedgerow trees. Through gate walk downhill close to hedge on your right. At bottom go through gate and turn right under railway bridge to follow rough lane for 600m to reach beautiful half timbered house and ford - lovely spot to linger. Soon reach road junction and turn right to reach starting point.
