



Pontesbury P3 Footpaths Group - Annual Report

The 'Pontesbury P3' (Parish Paths Partnership) is a group of local volunteers working in partnership with Shropshire Council, helping landowners meet their obligations to maintain public footpaths across their land. With materials provided by the council, the team provides volunteer labour one morning per week to keep footpaths open and maintained - only with permission of the land-owners of course.

2023 was a busy year for Pontesbury P3 Group, apart from limitations caused by the various floods. A new member join the group, who is also an active member of the Friends of Pontesford Hill group, which is a useful link. Chris Hearn has retired as Treasurer this year and Ken Jenks has retired from the group, both after many years of service for which we are very grateful.

Man-hours worked in 2023 were 487, completing 74 different items of work, covering path surveys, stile repair/replacement, vegetation clearing, bridge and gate repair, signposting & waymarking.

Regarding other local groups, again we have worked with the Friends of Pontesford Hill Group to find areas on Pontesford & Earl's Hills co-ordinating efforts to complete projects. The Pontesbury P3 Group continue to ask for direct referrals of problem paths with position references and photos from members of the public. The team is always on the lookout for footpaths, stiles, bridges, fingerposts etc. needing maintenance work in the Pontesbury Parish area and beyond as far as Longden, Minsterley and Snailbeach. If you see anything that the team could possibly repair or improve, please contact them at pontesburyp3@gmail.com. For each report they preferably require:

a) Grid reference (or What3Words); b) A photograph; c) Path number (Route Code) available from the map Shropshire outdoor recreation map.

I would like to thank all the volunteers who give up their Tuesday mornings to work for the group whatever the weather, the farmers and landowners for their co-operation in helping us access the routes on their land, and also Helen Beresford at Shropshire Council Rights of Way Office for all her help and assistance given to us.

On Friday 26th April, the Pontesbury Carers Support Group will be discussing Advance Care Planning.

Jayne Morris, who works with the NHS Engagement Team is coming to speak about a project in progress to improve Advance Care Planning and how to make the planning process suitable and available to anyone who would benefit from having an Advance Care Plan.

Currently people attending Severn Hospice, in care homes and those with long term neurological conditions receive help from health and social care professionals to complete an ACP which records their wishes for care and treatment over the last years of their life. We know that planning like this helps prevent unwanted hospital admissions and reduces stress on families and carers because everyone is clear who to contact when.

Carers have valuable insight and experience to be able to contribute to the thinking and re-design of the ACP.



Conservation Grazing with Goats on Earl's Hill.

The scree on the east face of Earl's Hill is a very rare and precious habitat. In recent years it has become overgrown with bramble, which is shading out the unique flora. We are trialling "conservation grazing" with six Golden Guernsey goats, who love to eat bramble, bracken and scrub and should be ideal for controlling the vegetation and restoring a natural balance. Golden Guernseys are a native breed, ideally suited to this habitat. They are very hardy and capable of living outside in all seasons.

The grazing trial is a partnership between Mossy Oaks, the Friends of Pontesford and Earls Hill, and Shropshire Wildlife Trust. The area that the goats graze is being controlled using NoFence collars. This means that the collars create invisible electric boundaries you cannot see. This allows us to graze the otherwise inaccessible slopes and target specific areas of ecological need.

Pontesbury & District Gardeners Association

The Annual General Meeting was held on 5th March. The Committee and Trustees were all re-elected *en bloc* and in their annual reports the Chairman, Treasurer and Trading Secretary all commented on how well the Association is doing. A lease on the trading Post was recently signed giving us security of tenure for the next 110 years.

Spring Planting

April in the garden is the time for potatoes to be planted. Traditionally it was Good Friday when this happened – that day being the first one in the Spring when the workers had a day off. However the date for Easter is determined by the lunar calendar and there are many gardeners who now plant and harvest by the phases of the moon, so both approaches seem to tie in well together!

There is still a danger of frost until the middle/end of May so look after tender plants and seedlings until then. If you don't have a greenhouse in which to shelter the smaller plants you can wrap them in horticultural fleece when frost is forecast.

Spring into the Garden

Don't forget the social evening at 7.30 on Thursday 16 May in the Public Hall. Admission is free, as are the refreshments, so all you have to pay for is anything that you buy from the plant and garden-related stalls that will be there. More information will be in next month's Newsletter.

At this point it is worth reminding ourselves that, although the Gardeners Association has been in Pontesbury for over eighty years, there are people new to the area who may not know how we work. The Association was formed with the aim of promoting gardening in the local area and now its main function is as a co-operative: buying garden consumables in bulk and reselling to members at rates lower than are normally found in garden centres, etc. The centre of activity is The Trading Post, which is a former railway shed by the old line in Pontesbury, and a view of the building itself is worth a visit.

For planting in Spring we have several varieties of seed potatoes, beetroot, pea and bean seeds and onion and shallot sets, which are sold in whatever quantity you want to buy. Wesell loose grass seed all year round.

The Trading Post is situated in the Old Station Buildings on Station Road and is open every Saturday from 9.30 to 12 noon.



Green-winged Orchids of Minsterley Meadows

As reported in last month's newsletter Minsterley Meadows is up for sale and the Minsterley Meadows working group is hopeful for the success of ongoing negotiations. If so, a campaign will be launched to raise the necessary funds to purchase the meadows. Minsterley Meadows (SSSI) is a threatened habitat of national importance. It contains an abundance of Green-winged Orchids, characteristic of this type of land, which are nationally scarce.

Green-winged Orchids

Green-winged Orchids (Anacemptis morio) are short plants with narrow leaves (height 7-15cm) which live on unimproved grassland. Their name comes from the green veins in the 'hoods' of the flowers. (See photo below). They are mainly a stunning purple but colours can range from shades of purple to pink and even white.





These orchids bloom in May and June and are pollinated by bumblebees.

Grasslands such as Minsterley Meadows, the home of the Greenwinged Orchid, are ancient habitats which are vulnerable to change. They need careful management and

hay cutting at the right time to ensure that they are kept in good condition. Cutting time is from mid-July to the end of August, after the flowers have set seed.


