Pontesbury Parish Council News

At the November meeting councillors received updates from the various local groups who are supporting people through the cost-of-living crisis. Parish Councillors wished to thank Pontesbury and Rea Valley Good Neighbours Scheme for their various projects, including the successful launching of the luncheon clubs at the Public Hall, and to the Churches for the opening the Foodbank. More information about these activities can be found elsewhere in the newsletter.

The Council also received the annual management report for Poles Coppice and were delighted to see how well the team are engaging with young people to attract them to this local reserve, which really is a rich source of biodiversity in the parish. Councillors agreed to continue giving an annual grant towards the upkeep of the reserve.

Various councillors have raised the issue of littering in the parish and councillors met with a Shropshire Council Officer to look at how this can be tackled. The parish council are hoping to work with Hanwood and Minsterley parish councils next year to organise a Rea Valley wide litter pick.

Another topic for discussion was the long-term plan for the very well-used play area off Station Road. A working group was set up to meet and look at possible sources of funding for managing and developing this vital community asset. The council would like interested residents to get involved, so please contact the clerk if you would like to be part of any play area refurbishment.

There is still a vacancy for the Pontesbury ward of the parish council following the resignation of Cllr Lynette Charles. If you would be interested in becoming a councillor please contact your local councillor or the Parish Clerk. Further useful information about what is involved in being a councillor can be found on the parish council website www.pontesburypc.org.uk

The next parish council meeting will be held on Monday 12th December, 6.30pm at The Pavilion. Please note the change of time. From October to April the parish council meetings start at the earlier time of 6.30pm.






Crochet Workshop

Round Up of Pontesbury and Rea Valley Good Neighbours events and activities 2022

Pontesbury and Rea Valley Good Neighbours Committee have organised a large number of events and activities during 2022, bringing the community together and helping those who are alone, most vulnerable or just in need of a cup of coffee and a chat!

Coffee mornings have been held at The Plough every month during 2022, giving an opportunity for those who do not get out and about very often to meet new people in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere. We would like to thank Amy, Derek & Ali for all their support throughout the year and for allowing us to hold the coffee mornings at The Plough.

Several coffee mornings have also been held in Minsterley, to help those who wish to attend in that area, thank you for the support of Minsterley Parish Hall who have waivered the cost for these events.

Smaller "coffee and chat" groups and a Gentlemen's Club have also been arranged during 2022, with great success and wonderful support from the community. If you have attended, our thanks go to you all.

In addition, the Good Neighbours committee have an "On Call" phone, which has enabled the team to respond to requests for prescriptions and medication, access to help lines for energy issues, mental health agencies and assistance, help with shopping, access to local food banks — even finding a mobile hairdresser for a lady who was unable to leave her home.

The Befriending service has been operating all year, some by telephone and some involving home visits from Good Neighbours volunteers – whatever the individual requests. Matching the individual with a regular volunteer visit or call has helped to break the loneliness and vulnerability that some of our residents are feeling, particularly in the aftermath of the pandemic.

Good Neighbours have been able to organise several "Pop Up Larder" events in both Pontesbury and Minsterley. These events have been extremely well received by those who are struggling with the rising costs of everything. The committee would like to say a massive thank you to a local couple who asked for donations to the 'pop up Larders' in lieu of gifts for their wedding, we were overwhelmed with the donations of food, cleaning items, baby food, nappies and much much more and a generous donation of £150.00. We would also like to thank anyone who has donated food via Hignett's or Pontesbury Co-op to the Pop Up Larders held during 2022 and to both Minsterley Parish Hall & Pontesbury Parish Council.

Following the success of the "100 Club" this year, the committee will be running the club again in 2023. For a cost of £12 per year, each member of the club is allocated a number, and monthly draws give cash prizes to those whose numbers are drawn from the hat. Should you wish to become a member and purchase your own lucky number, please get in touch with the Good Neighbours.

None of this would take place without the generosity of Pontesbury Parish Council, the community, local businesses, Severn Rotary Club, Howard Thorne and our devoted volunteers on the committee.



December in the Garden

At this time of year there is not too much happening in the garden; there are still some brave flowers showing their faces, and a few crops in the veg garden ready to be harvested, but most of us prefer to be indoors.

There are still some jobs that can be done on a fine day. Most shrubs are best pruned straight after flowering during the growing season, but over winter the leaves have fallen and the structure of the shrub, or tree, can be seen more clearly: any branches that cross and are likely to rub on adjacent ones and can be removed. Do be aware that winter pruning promotes growth and cutting a branch along its length may result in growth of a number of vertical, whippy twigs, known as water shoots. Remove any branch close to its source on the main branch to prevent this.

The ground is wet at this time of year and walking on it can result in compaction, and thus poor growth next summer. This applies to lawns, but going over the lawn with a garden fork, sticking it in a few inches and wiggling it about, can relieve any of the compaction that built up over the summer. This also gives the roots access to air and helps their growth, giving stronger plants for next year.

Pontesbury Gardeners' Association's Trading Post is closed until 4 February so you need to look elsewhere for your Xmas shopping! Gardeners among you will always welcome some warm socks for inside their wellies at this time of year, and to go with them a warm pair of gardening gloves.

During winter months the gardener spends much of

the time clearing up spent annuals and taking the tops off perennials, as well as trimming shrubs, hedges and trees. Rather than putting all this material in the green bin it will benefit the garden if it is composted and then added to the soil once broken down. A shredder to chop up the woody stuff is always useful, but as shredders are in a different price bracket to a pair of socks a bit of research is needed before buying. Similarly a compost bin is always useful, and two are better than one: one to material that's rotting down and you are taking from, and one to be adding to. However, hold the like shredders these bins are worth researching first: ones at least a metre across and a metre deep are more efficient than smaller ones.

If your gardener grows most of your plants (flowers or veg) from seed, then seed trays with propaga-

^************

tor tops, and maybe a heated base, will help enormously. Windowsills in south-facing spare bedrooms often act as a useful place to germinate seeds and bring on seedlings early in the year, but may not be popular with guests!

But, whatever presents you buy, be sure to enjoy yourself, particularly if you are eating your home-grown veg for Xmas lunch.






