Safe Places in Pontesbury Parish - the aim of Safe Places throughout Shropshire are to help make safer communities. Community venues, shops and businesses can all be safe places. *Safe Places are for everyone.*

So, as well as Allcare in Pontesbury, new Safe Places include Hignett's, the Pavilion and the Coop, who have all recently signed up to be a Safe Place.

Each safe place will display a building sticker such as that pictured and cards can be issued to people who wish to use the scheme, the cards give someone's name and contact details for a family member or carer, to assist the person in the Safe Place to make contact with a family member or guardian.

Initial funding to set up the Safe Places initiative was from West Mercia Police (WMP) who totally support the project, and the scheme is currently financed by car boot sales/table top sales. Safe Places has just had a successful bid to Mid Counties Coop to assist with funding to improve the website.

Cards are available for your loved ones at each venue, call in and see us to sign up.

Pontesbury Cricket Club Women Scoop Top Prize

Pontesbury were named Shropshire Cricket Women and Girls club of the year for 2023. The presentation was made at the Shropshire Cricket Board awards held at the Albright Hussey Hotel on Friday10th November.

The award was recognition for continued development of the Pontesbury CC women and girls section both on and off the field. On the field the club has girls representing Shropshire at U11 and U13 age groups, with those girls picking up awards at the recent junior awards.



Off the field the women have taken up coaching

and team management roles to support the ongoing development of the clubs juniors.

To support the growth of women and girls cricket in Pontesbury the England and Wales Cricket Board gave a grant of £10,000 towards the upgrading of the facilities in the pavilion including an additional changing room with toilet and showers for women and girls.

Our women play hardball and soft ball cricket catering for players of all abilities from beginners to experienced hardball players.

NATURAL ENGLAND

Notes from the hill

Well we have certainly had our fair share of rain this autumn with storm Babet delivering an awful lot of water in a short time, which as many will be aware, has caused considerable damage to some of the tracks on the hill, particularly up Perkins Beach. We have put up closed signs on this bridleway for safety reasons, due to there being an eroded crevasse over a metre deep in places. Work should be starting on its repair soon and will certainly be completed before Christmas and the boxing day "Dash or Dawdle".

If you are out and about on the hill over Christmas look out for the large flocks of thrushes that come to the reserve to feed on the berry bearing trees such as rowan, hawthorn and holly. The redwings and fieldfares come all the way from Scandinavia to join our resident thrushes, and mistle thrushes can often be heard defending their favourite bushes from these viking raiders.

Also take time to watch the ravens as they are likely to be showing off their aerial skills to each other as they pair up ready to nest as early as January. They are best watched at the top of the steep hillsides where they use the uplifting air to better perform their acrobatics.


