Shropshire Council Matters - Shropshire Councillor Roger Evans reports:

Finances: The quarter 2 report, which is also the half year finance report, is showing a slight improvement in the general reserves, due in part to income for the green waste collection. A yearend overspend of £35m is forecast. This still places the council in a critical position, as recently reported in the Shropshire Star.

The raises in employer NI contributions will be covered by Central Government. This will not be the case for local councils. The budget also intimated that more funding would be given to improve bus services. From initial reports the extra support for Shropshire in the near future will be very limited..

Grants: The joint Shropshire Council/Veolia community grants scheme is open again

CCTV: The Shrewsbury CCTV is now an unmanned facility

Leisure Services review: There is to be a review consultation launched in the near future.

Pontesbury Parish Council - At the November parish council meeting Councillors received a short presentation from Shropshire Hills Landscape Trust about how parish councils could support the work of this partnership and the grants that the Trust have available for community projects to enhance conservation/ biodiversity development in the National Landscape area within the parish. The Shropshire Hills National Landscape partnership was previously known as the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. There is a longer article about the work of the Trust elsewhere in the newsletter. Local Councils have a duty to promote biodiversity and consider the impact of their activities on biodiversity within their jurisdiction.

By January the parish council need to set the precept for the coming financial year 2025-26. As part of this process the parish council reviews its Strategic Plan and prioritises projects for the following year. There are two major projects the parish council are undertaking over the next couple of years. The first is to install solar panels on the Pavilion roof to reduce the energy costs for the building and in keeping with the council's aim of reaching carbon net zero by 2030. The second is the much-needed refurbishment of the public toilets. The Strategic Plan can be found at www.pontesburyparishcouncil.org.uk.

2025 will bring local elections at parish and county level. If you are interested in becoming a parish councillor please come and find out more at one of our council open days, planned for Spring 2025. These will be advertised in the newsletter in the New Year.

Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year from all of us at the council. We look forward to working with you in 2025.

Sad Death of Mary Webb Society President

It was with great sadness that Mary Webb Society members learnt that our president and friend, Dr Gladys Mary Coles, had died suddenly on 7th October at the age of 89. As well as being our president and guiding light, Gladys Mary was the leading biographer of Mary Webb and a lifelong champion of this Shropshire writer's life and works.

A proud Liverpoolian born in Everton, Gladys Mary was a lecturer in Creative Writing, also an accomplished artist and gifted poet and novelist. Spending much of WW2 in Wales gave her a deep love of that country. She died after having enjoyed a writers' workshop in Wales with friends. Gladys Mary also had a great affinity with Shropshire, especially this area, 'Mary Webb Country', where Mary Webb based her novels. Mary's second novel 'Gone to Earth' was completed in Pontesbury, the Webbs' home for much of WW1. This was made into a Hollywood movie in 1950, with scenes filmed in this area and many local people as extras.

Gladys Mary enjoyed giving countless talks for the society at many village halls here including Worthen, Snailbeach and Pontesbury. Mary Webb's first novel 'The Golden Arrow' was based on the legend of a golden arrow said to be lost on Pontesford Hill. In April 2015, to support the campaign to Save Pontesford Hill, Gladys Mary gave a talk on Mary Webb in Pontesbury at the Public Hall.

This amazing woman has continued to inspire and enthrall us with her incisive knowledge and passion for her subject. We will remember her for her warmth and wit, her friendship and her unique gifts. She is irreplaceable and will be sadly and greatly missed.

MINSTERLEY MEADOWS SAVED



Following an intense 10-month campaign the species rich Minsterley Meadows SSSI has been purchased by and for the community!

Over £155,000 was raised by local people and organisations. That figure combined with part of a National Lottery Heritage Fund grant, has enabled Middle Marches Community Land Trust to purchase the land for the local community and wildlife. Further funds granted by the National Lottery as part of the £224,000 bid will be put towards three years of management and community engagement on and around the meadows. With over 5,000 Green-Winged Orchids as well as many other wildflower species the meadow is an ecological haven open for the public to enjoy!

Members of the Middle Marches Community Land Trust, Marches Meadow Group and Minsterley Meadows campaign steering group extend their sincere gratitude to those who donated their time, pledged money and spread the word about the campaign. Another big thank you must go to the National Lottery Heritage Fund for their generous grant, and grateful thanks to the players of the National Lottery! The community responded to the call and this grant is your reward. It will enable us to ensure that the meadows will be enjoyed, valued, cared for and sustained, not only now but in the years to come.

Pontesbury and Minsterley Verge Restoration Project

Four sections of the road verges between Pontesbury and Minsterley are part of a long term plan for restoration to a more natural and nature-friendly state.

Over the past year Yellow Rattle has been successfully planted to help thin out the thick grass, therefore providing space for other wild flowers to grow, which are being sown this Autumn. The wild flowers will be appropriate to our local soil and area, including Meadow Cranesbill, Knapweed, Chamomile, Pink Clover etc. These are flowers from our old meadows, over 90% of which have been destroyed since the 1950s.



These verge areas need to be mown at least twice a year, in late spring and late summer, and all the cuttings removed to keep the areas low in nutrients. This involves financial costs which are being met by Pontesbury and Minsterley Parish Councils.

We hope that the restored areas will soon be rich in wild flowers to attract and feed pollinators such as bees and butterflies and provide shelter and food for many other insects and even small



mammals. We may also be able to extend the project in the future to more of the verge, if funding is available.

This ongoing project has been supported and facilitated by the Parish Councils, Pontesbury Climate Emergency Action Group and Restoring Shropshire's Verges Project (RSVP).

A special mention to Pontesbury Parish Councillor Doug Jones who has taken responsibility for looking after these areas and helping to improve them for the benefit of us all.

Working alongside the [National Landscape Partnership](#), the Trust supports activities which protect the wildlife and heritage of the Shropshire Hills, and enables local people, businesses and organisations to become involved in caring for the countryside around them.

Money raised by the Trust is distributed to projects in the community. Most of it is given in small grants through the Conservation Fund, but the Trust also has public appeals for specific projects.

The Conservation Fund is a small grant pot to support practical projects that help to conserve, enhance and raise awareness of the Shropshire Hills National Landscape.

Priority areas for projects are:

Conserving and enhancing the natural beauty, landscape, wildlife or heritage of the Shropshire Hills. Educational and awareness-raising activities relating to the area and its conservation, especially involving young people.

From September 2024 we have 2 rounds of funding available:

We can support activity over this winter. Projects must be completed by March/April 2025.

We can support year-long projects to start in April 2025 and complete by end of March 2026.

Who can apply

Public, private, voluntary sector and community groups can apply, along with individuals and businesses, but in all cases the project must show a clear public benefit. You don't have to live or work within the Shropshire Hills National Landscape to apply, as long as your project delivers benefits to it.

Priority is given to first-time applicants.

Grants will be in the range of £500 – £2,000. Grants can be of up to 75% and match funding can be made up of in kind and volunteer time contributions as well as cash. Applications will be strengthened by showing other sources of funding.




NATURAL ENGLAND - Notes from the hill

This month's edition of Notes from the Hill is the last one which covers one of our twelve featured species that have action plans produced by the Stepping Stones Project. The last of the twelve is the otter, although generally won't be found on the Stiperstones, the health of its riverine environment will certainly be affected by what goes on up in the hills. There has been a push on the Stiperstones, and on other sites in the Shropshire Hills, to help "slow the flow" and hold back water in the hills by blocking drainage ditches and rewetting marshes and bogs so that water is released slowly into the catchment of these rivers. Actions like these are becoming more and more necessary as we start to see the implications of climate change and more frequent flood events in the lowlands.

Otter in the Stepping Stones Project Area



The elusive otter is one of our top predators feeding on fish, amphibians and crustacea. One of the nearest records that I remember is from the Bridges where otters were feeding on signal crayfish in the stream near to the Youth Hostel. I once, also remember watching a couple of otters playing further down where the East and west Onny rivers meet.



Sightings may be rare but as these animals are largely nocturnal their presence is best shown by the signs that they leave behind. Footprints can often be seen particularly in soft sandy deposits and their five webbed toes are bigger than a mink's. Otters also leave spraints in prominent places, such as fallen trees, weirs and bridges, as 'scented messages', helping them to find mates and defend territories. They contain visible fish bones and have a distinctive, pleasant musky smell,

which has been said to be reminiscent of jasmine tea.

Once restricted to Scotland and a few small areas of England and Wales. Now, the otter is extending its range into former territories and has increased locally, though the population is still fragmented, and it remains on the global red list of threatened species. Like with most top predators its presence alone can be a sign of a healthy environment, although if it is surviving on an invasive crayfish maybe that may not always be the case.

Actions identified in the plan include: further survey work, habitat improvements and the removal of barriers to fish passage.

ANPR Cameras As reported in previous newsletters, the parish council is committed to working with our partners to reduce speeding. In 2022, the Safer Speed Shropshire ANPR camera partnership was established, working with the police and our A488 neighbours, Minsterley PC and Hanwood PC to tackle speeding. The ANPR system has been successful in reducing speeds. The first phase of the project has involved writing to speeding offenders. The project is now moving into Phase 2, where the police will use data from the cameras to identify when and where to deploy mobile speed enforcement patrols. This will involve using technology such as TruCam, which is an advanced mobile camera capable of catching many vehicles and issuing Notices of Intended Prosecution. We are very pleased to be working with the police on this project, and will be providing more detailed reports on the enforcement in future newsletters.
