
Pounds, shilling and pence

Up until January 1970, we paid for goods and services in pennies and shillings - with 12 pennies to a shilling, and 20 shillings to the pound. On 15th February 1970 the country converted to decimal. Banks were closed for four days in advance to prepare for the change. The cost of converting telephone boxes across the country was £3m. While some new currency had been in circulation prior to the change over date, with the 50p coin appearing in 1969 (known as a 10 shilling coin at the time), it wasn't until 15th February that the new 1p and 2p coins were introduced to the general public.

What ward do you represent? Cruckton Ward

Why did you become a parish councillor? I became interested in the Parish Council after speaking for a planning application on behalf of a neighbour, with the help of Councillor Allan Hodges. I then got involved with the Neighbourhood Plan Committee, we have successfully submitted a draft plan to Shropshire Council for approval. This then sparked my interest in becoming a Parish Councillor, wishing to become more involved in the community.

If you had enough money to fund a project in Pontesbury parish, what would you do? I enjoy gardening, growing my own fruit and vegetables, and it's a great way to get fresh air and exercise. I think a project to give people with small or no gardens the same opportunity would be good for the community, a small area for allotments or community garden.

There is still a vacancy for the Pontesbury ward of the parish council following a resignation. Pontesbury Parish Council News

At the January meeting each year councillors turn their attention to setting the precept for the following financial year – 2023-24. This done in two phases with the Finance and General Purposes Committee going through the previous year's costs in detail (prepared by parish council staff) and thinking about the year to come, before drawing up a budget. The proposed budget is then presented to full council at the January Full Council meeting. This thorough double examination means that as a council we are confident that we have prepared well and provided best value for money for the local community. This year was particularly difficult in the light of the cost-of-living crisis, so we have kept meeting our rising costs to a minimum. The precept is a 12.69% increase on last year, which means £1.40/month or 32p per week increase for a Band D property. Chairman Cllr Duncan Fletcher and/or Parish Clerk are happy to take questions from anyone about the precept.

The parish council have funded a new community noticeboard which is sited on School Green. One side is for parish council news, the other for community events. Please feel free to put up your posters. Please don't post over somebody else's event but feel free to take down posters of events that have already happened.

You will also have noticed near the noticeboard is the long-awaited replacement Platinum Jubilee Oak tree which was given to us by Shropshire Council. We have also planted one in Cruckton.

The next parish council meeting will be held on Monday 13th February, 6.30pm at The Pavilion. Please note the change of time. From October to April the parish council meetings start at the earlier time of 6.30pm.

The next Planning Committee meeting will be held on Monday 6th February 2023 at 6.30pm at the Pavilion. Please contact Deputy Clerk deputy@pontesburypc.org.uk if you would like to attend and/or raise any issues.





TACKLING THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY

Pontesbury Parish Council

Declaration of Climate Emergency

January 2020

In January 2020 PPC resolved to declare a climate emergency and to aim for net zero carbon by 2030.

The council also helped to bring together interested local residents to form a community group - Pontesbury Climate Emergency Action Group (PCEAG) who first met in February 2020 and were very excited to undertake all sorts of projects.

During Lockdown, within guidelines, PCEAG held a series of virtual talks including: Centre for Sustainable Energy, Phil Holden from Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Beauty, Hedgehog Officer from Shropshire Wildlife Trust and Nancy the Wildlife Gardener

Raise awareness through monthly 'just one thing' articles in the village newsletter. We also carried out a series of quick win activities that also served to raise awareness locally of the group and its aims inc.;

- planting a hedge alongside a main thoroughfare,
- planting an area of pollinating plants and planting wildflowers and bulbs along the footpath to the play area.

In each of these areas we put up a weatherproof sign telling people what we had done and why, accompanied by the group's logo (designed by a young resident).

As restricted lifted, regular events were held:

- 'Spring back on your bike' event to encourage active travel; an information event about waste and recycling; Repair
- Cafes and a series of talks including topics such as wildflower verges and tree planting.
- Members of the group have also held 'Carbon Conversations' by sitting in the local library on Saturday mornings and chatting to people who want to find out more about how to reduce their carbon footprint.

Areas the action group plan to focus on next are:

- Local food and community growing. By matching residents who are struggling to maintain their garden with people looking for space to grow food and to promote growing your own food an event is planned for Spring 2023 at The Pavilion
- Continuing with projects to increase biodiversity in the parish tree/hedge planting and wildflower meadow creation including a verge alongside the cycleway there will also be educational events to raise awareness locally
- Encouraging people to use carbon footprint tools to raise awareness of areas in which to reduce consumption/carbon emissions and then annually reviewing their footprint to see what effect the changes have made

Parish Council climate mitigation activities

As well as supporting the work of the Pontesbury Climate Emergency Action group, the parish council aim to audit council buildings, services and activities and draw up an action plan to work towards these being net zero carbon by 2030.

One of the largest sources of carbon emissions for the council is the community building that they own and run. A carbon and energy audit of the building has been undertaken, and the parish council are currently exploring installing energy generation equipment such as an Air Source Heat Pump and photovoltaic cells/battery in order to reduce the carbon emissions of the building by up to 85%. The aim is for the building to model ideas that local residents could implement in their own homes, including reducing single plastic use in the building; increasing recycling, rainwater harvesting and community growing in planters around the building.

Other climate change mitigation projects the parish council are exploring/have completed include:

- Solar lighting along a cycleway linking Pontesbury to Minsterley to further encourage cycling & walking for school, work and leisure purposes
- Converting all of the streetlights to LED units to reduce energy use
- An approved list of local contractors/suppliers to reduce transport distances
- Speed calming projects to reduce traffic speed and carbon emissions throughout the parish
- Cycle to work scheme for parish council staff and councillors
- Tree and hedge planting on parish council land and with local landowners/groups






Swallowtail in flight, Norfolk
