Pontesbury Carer's Support Group meet on the last Friday of every month in the Pavilion - next meeting on Friday 26th January from 10.30am to 12 noon. Unpaid carers are welcome to attend and we aim to bring information you, the carer, wants to know about.

At the last group meeting in November 2023, we had an interactive music session. It was really appreciated and very much enjoyed by everyone, bringing much needed light relief to the carers and the music session especially seemed to help distract from the daily impact and stress of caring. The 'cared for' who attended the group also appreciated the music, especially those that usually find it difficult to join in easily due to memory issues, so this was really positive.

There were about 13 carers at the group, plus 4 'cared for' - this included 3 new carers. However everyone fully joined in the music session and they are all hoping to come again to the next group.

Music uses different parts of the brain from language, so can be used to communicate with people with dementia, even if they no longer speak or seem to understand others' words. As a result, it can help them express feelings and ideas and interact with others. It also reduces social isolation and encourages more physical activity through dancing or moving to the music. It appeared to help everyone connect with the group and allowed group members to try something different - hopefully learning that they may now use music at home to help themselves and person they support.

Adrian, the music leader took his time to emphasise how everyone can continue to use music at home to

improve quality of life, not just for themselves but also for the person they support .

Thank you to Pontesbury Parish Council for providing the funds to pay for the Interactive Musician.

West Shropshire Flower Club The flower club had a real treat at its Christmas Demonstration in December with the fabulous Mark Entwistle, and his Believe in Christmas demonstration. He started with a bang, a huge red tropical Christmas arrangement with a Heliconia, an eye watering number of Aranthera orchid stems, Alpinia ginger flowers and anthuriums. He then went on to show that a Christmas arrangement can be made in any colour. Floating above a cloud of low gypsophila were delicate orange Heliconia, with orange sprayed birch twigs, orange mini gerbera and mokara orchids lower still. To add that Christmas feel white and metallic orange baubles elevated on sticks within the arrangement. His 'traditional Christmas arrangement' had white delphiniums bursting star like and purple carnations kept long for impact and

colour giving space and volume in the arrangement, finished with white Singapore orchids. Next Christmas design, pink lilies flowed through the upright design, with spray roses and hypericum berries to give contrasting shapes, cerise Singapore orchids, gold Pennisetum grass on a stand with pink baubles and a matching wreath. Then to more traditional Christmas Red, within the traditional Christmas foliage of ivy, holly and conifer, were gorgeous red gerberas, gold anthuriums and red birch twigs. For his final design he went contemporary country house arrangement, everything was grouped to provide a stronger feature, white snapdragons, green chrysanthemums, white carnations and Singapore orchids and softened with balls of white hydrangea. Most of these arrangements were accompanied by additional matching placements, which resulted in the stage being packed full of wonderful flowers by the end of the evening and much anticipation for the raffle!

NATURAL ENGLAND Notes from the Hill

The hill is still very wet after such a wet run up to Christmas, however the damage to the tracks in Perkins Beach caused by storm Babet have now been repaired and are open again. If visiting the reserve over the Christmas break listen out for red grouse, as they start to become more vocal as the days lengthen.

The Stepping Stones project has been working on restoring habitat connections across the area for nine years now. During that time, it has worked with farmers to create whole farm plans that look at the farm business whilst also looking at the potential for conservation improvements. It has helped community wildlife groups in the area develop and has led a host of volunteers in a range of conservation projects. For me, one of the best outcomes from the project has been seeing community volunteers and farmers coming together through tree and hedge planting days.

The project focuses on five key habitats: heath and acid grassland, where the Stiperstones and Long Mynd have the largest areas; native woodlands including upland oak woodlands; ffridd, which is the scrubby wooded hillsides which are generally an undervalued wildlife rich habitat; wildlife friendly wetlands such as marshy areas, wet woodland, streams and rivers; grasslands, after we have lost so many of these flower rich sites.

To promote the restoration and best management of these five habitats the project has listed a number of important species as flagships for each of them and to start with it has chosen 12 species and produced conservation action plans for each of them:

Dipper / Willow tit / Snipe / Tree pipit / Small pearl-bordered fritillary / Bilberry bumblebee / Upland dragonflies / Dormouse / Otter / Cowberry / Devil's bit scabious / Yellow mountain pansy

Each species has a species champion who will help push forward some of the actions identified in the plans.

On Friday the 23rd of February at Norbury Village Hall, there will be a conference where you can meet the species champions, hear about these exciting creatures, and find out what you could do to help, not only with the conservation of these species but the habitats that they represent.

PUBLIC MEETING: SATURDAY 6 JANUARY 2024 MINSTERLEY VILLAGE HALL, 10AM TO 12 NOON

Join us for a public meeting to gauge interest amongst the local community for a fund-raising appeal to purchase this important site as a community asset forever.

Minsterley Meadows consists of two flower-rich hayfields (around 13.5 acres in all) on the eastern outskirts of Minsterley just off Callow Lane. They are designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest by Natural England for their important plants.

Alongside a range of meadow plants is the striking feature of thousands of rare Green-winged Orchids which flower in late May - the largest Green-winged Orchid site in Shropshire.

The hedges are thick and full of birdlife and there are several large old oak trees on the boundaries which form a corridor through to Callow Hill woods, hillfort and quarry.
