What was it like running the London Marathon?

Why did you decide to run the London marathon?

I watched my niece's husband run the London Marathon back in 2019, it was an amazing atmosphere just being a spectator, I thought then that I'd love to actually run it one year. Sadly, my brother in law, Alan Hughes, passed away last September, so I knew all about Lingen Davies and the Cancer Charity. I decided, what better way to take part in this incredible event by helping to raise money for this wonderful charity.

What was your training plan?

A 16-233k training plan for beginners, mainly consisting of 3 runs per week, so I added strength training and lots of swimming into it as well, because I needed to get myself fit and healthier.

Did you ever feel like giving up and what motivated you to keep going?

As soon as I started training I posted my JustGiving page and sent out lots of emails to businesses. I started to receive sponsorship from people and businesses straight away – with my determination and now sponsorship - that was great motivation.

Also, thinking of the amazing treatment and care that my brother-in-law received during his 2-year battle with cancer kept me going. The charity enabled him to enjoy family holidays, walk his youngest daughter down the aisle – spend extra-special time with his gorgeous grand-children and see his beautiful granddaughter being born. The family were able to make lots more memories to treasure during those 2 years thanks to Lingen Davies.

How did you feel arriving in London?

I was super-excited about the whole experience, from picking up my bib, to taking part on the day.

Were you nervous or excited on the day?

I was only a tad nervous on the day, but my excitement totally outweighed any nerves.

What was the atmosphere like?

It's very hard to describe just how amazing the atmosphere was, from start to finish it was just incredible. Considering we had lots of rain I couldn't believe how many people still lined the streets, there were bands & singers playing all over the place, people on their balconies dancing to music, kids waiting to high-five us (I tried to high-five as many as I could), and people offering refreshments. It's an experience that I'll never forget.

How did you feel running round?

I felt emotional at times, but also proud that I was taking part in the London Marathon. There were lots of poignant parts; Tower Bridge was one of them, seeing Big Ben and Buckingham Palace; having your name shouted out by complete strangers was very overwhelming; they say you normally hit a wall, but I never did, I was never going to give up – I could not have let all my supporters down.

What went through your mind when you heard/saw family cheering you on?

I was extremely emotional when I say my family at 3 different points, I knew roughly where they'd be which helped, but to see your name on a banner and have that support from my family really got to me.

How did you feel when you ran over the finish line?

Seeing the finish line was amazing, the last 200m felt like the longest 200m I'd ever run in my life — knowing that you'd completed a marathon (but not just any marathon, the actual London Marathon) is simply awesome, a feeling of great achievement that I will never forget. I have raised £9,693.88 for Lingen Davies so far. A huge thank you to everyone of you who has supported me.

Pontesbury Parish Council News

The Council held its last Parish Meeting on Tuesday 9th May 2023, due to the bank holiday. The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 12th June 2023, at 7.30pm in the Pavilion.

The last parish council meeting was the annual meeting where councillors elect a Chairman, Vice Chairmen and Committee members are nominated and agreed. By a unanimous vote, Councillor Duncan Fletcher was once again voted in as Chairman and Councillors Nick Hignett and Michelle Trow are Vice Chairmen. The Chairman gave a vote of thanks to Councillor John Pritchard for his welcome advice and work throughout his tenure as Vice Chairman.

PCSO Sarah Edwards attended the meeting on behalf of the Safer Neighbourhood Team and several issues were raised. One matter was parking near junctions - vehicles should park 10m or 33 feet away from any junction. The local policing team will be monitoring the situation in the parish and may issue B20 advisory notices regarding the matter. Shropshire Councillor Roger Evans reported that the Local Government Boundary Commission report had been received by Shropshire Council, giving details of the Shropshire Councillor ward boundaries - currently open for consultation. A parish council boundary review will take place following this.





We started with some fatsia leaves, then went on to discover how to split a phormium leaf into 6 and weave the strands into a rose. 

From Tuesday 2 May 2023 people can share their thoughts about an ambitious proposed network of new and upgraded walking and cycling routes across Shropshire – including new cycle lanes, footpaths, crossings and bridges.

A six-week consultation into Shropshire's draft Cycling and Walking Plan runs until 16 June.

The cycling and walking plan (also referred to as the LCWIP*) sets out a 10-year plan for delivering new or improved infrastructure for walking and cycling in Shropshire – to encourage more people to choose active modes of travel wherever possible.

The plan focuses on seven key market towns – Shrewsbury, Oswestry, Bridgnorth, Market Drayton, Church Stretton, Ludlow and Whitchurch. These areas have the largest numbers of people and therefore offer the greatest opportunity to increase levels of cycling and walking.

Pontesbury Gardeners' News (100th message)

This is the time of year when you can sit back for a while and enjoy your garden. The last frost should have been and gone, and summer bedding planted out, the hanging baskets and pots placed outside where they look the best, and the fruit bushes starting to bear their crops. Pontesbury Gardeners Association have developed a mixture of various composts and growing media specifically for hanging baskets and patio pots: this is PonGarMix (Pontesbury Gardeners Mixture), and comes in reasonable sized, and reasonably priced, bags.

Work isn't over entirely as the pots and baskets need watering and the weeds are also growing. You also need to feed your flowers and veg crops to ensure that you get the best from both. Tomato food is a good general purpose food for flowers and fruit, and at the Trading Post we have other feeds for particular groups of plants. We have a good stock of netting to protect your crops from pests that would eat them before you get the chance.

NATURAL ENGLAND Notes from the hill

It has been a wet spring this year which has benefitted some of the wetland habitats on the hill. The Stiperstones is not known for its wetlands, however the springs that emerge from the hill feed some of the sites richest wildlife areas with clean water of varying acidity. These areas of spring fed mire and bog are known as flushes and they are home to a wealth of plantlife, insects and birds. Unfortunately they are not as large as they might be, for when they meet the adjoining farmland they are often channelled into drainage gulleys to hasten the water downhill. In recent years, with hotter summers, many of the springs have been drying up, which puts these wet flushes at risk of disappearing altogether. It is in these wet flushes and pools that our upland dragonfies can be found. The two key upland species in our area are the black darter and the golden-ringed dragonfly.



The golden-ringed dragonfly is our longest dragonfly and is associated with small acidic streams on heaths and moors. As a flying adult it is an impressive and fast predator, large enough to take other dragonflies, wasps and bumblebees. It is also an ambush predator in its larval form, when it lives buried at the bottom of small streams. Acidic streams have few nutrients and so have limited productivity, for this reason the larvae are very slow growing and can spend as long as seven years in the water before emerging as an adult dragonfly. This long period of time as a larvae makes them particularly sensitive to periods of drought or pollution incidents.

The black darter is at the other extreme, it is the smallest dragonfly in the UK. It is a delightful dragonfly with stunning black and yellow markings. Unlike the golden-ringed it prefers still water and breeds in shallow acidic pools. It is a late flying species best seen between July and September and again is an efficient predator of other insects.

Generally dragonflies are coping well with climate change, they benefit from higher temperatures and are a mobile adaptable group. The 2021 state of dragonflies report, reported that 41% of our dragon and damselfly species have significantly increased in their ranges since 1970. Only 5 species have declined and these included the black darter and the golden-ringed dragonflies.


