Nothing says that it is spring more than the garden waking up into growth and the Trading Post re-opening to provide local gardeners with the materials that they will need; the Trading Post opened on Saturday 4 February and is situated in the Old Station Buildings on Station Road, opening every Saturday from 9.30 to 12 noon, from now until the end of October.

Trading Post new stock of seed potatoes is available and details of the varieties are on the Facebook page. There are also pea, bean and beetroot seeds, onion and shallot sets, as well as plenty of all the other materials that you will need to get sowing and growing.

The bulk delivery of multi-purpose potting compost has arrived and the usual offer of a reduced price for three bags is in place; we also have peat-free multipurpose compost but this isn't on special offer due to the ongoing difficulty in obtaining sufficient supplies. As usual there will be people on hand to help carry the heavy stuff to your car.

Why not visit the Trading Post on a Saturday morning and buy your gardening supplies locally.

What ward do you represent? Pontesbury Ward [Shropshire Councillor for Rea Valley Ward]



Why did you become a parish councillor? I have lived In Pontesbury all of my life, running a family business, established in 1919 by my Grandfather. My roles have included - Governor and PTA member of Pontesbury Primary School, PTA Member of Mary Webb School, 11 years as a retained firefighter at Minsterley-achieving the rank of Leading Firefighter, Chairperson of Pontesbury Players Drama Group, Trustee of Pontesbury Public Hall. The progression to standing as a Parish Councillor in 2005 seemed somewhat inevitable!

If you had enough money to fund a project in Pontesbury parish, what would you do? Pontesbury is an incredible place to live, but I would fund the provision of a central car park (at least 50 spaces) with a village green, leading down to the brook, to encourage more visitors to sample the incredible walks and scenery surrounding us.

Grow your own Food Event

This is planned for April 22nd at the Pavilion to promote the idea of growing your own food, whether you have a large garden or just a window box!

Part of the event will be a seedling and spare seed stall for either exchanging or for taking for free to avoid waste and share resources.

Why not start growing food crops now in small pots (maybe using recycled materials) in green houses, windowsills or sheltered spots – get the children or grandchildren involved perhaps, or join up with neighbours. Runner beans, peas and sunflowers for example are good starters for beginners and children. For the more experienced who might end up with more than they can plant out, just bring them along on the day.

Why peat free!

Our homes and gardens have an important role in the fight against climate change. Help preserve vital peatland by going peat free.

Peat has been a major ingredient of the compost used in gardening for many vears. This peat is dug out of wild places, damaging some of the last remaining peatlands in both the UK and overseas in places like Eastern Europe.



This process also releases carbon into the atmosphere, accelerating climate change. Sadly, more than 94% of the UK's lowland peat bogs have been destroyed or damaged, and a wealth of wildlife has disappeared along with it. This vital habitat isn't easily replaced.

Peat-free growing media, including compost and soil conditioners, are increasingly available. Peatlands are amazingly wild places, home to rare and unusual plants, birds and insects. Peat forms at an incredibly slow rate, accumulating on average only 1mm a year - that means it takes 1,000 years for one metre of peat to form!

The key component of peat is a moss called sphagnum, which forms multi-coloured carpets across the landscape and breaks down very slowly under the waterlogged conditions.

Why are peatlands important?

Our UK peatlands store an amazing 3.2 billion tonnes of carbon. They cover just 3% of land area but in that pack 30% of all soil carbon! In a healthy state, they are also beautiful, dramatic landscapes, home to rare and endangered wildlife such as large heath butterflies and wading birds like dunlin. But there is even more to peatlands, as they help to alleviate flooding, by slowing the flow of water and filter water, making it cleaner when it comes to our water processing plants - and eventually into our taps. 70% of drinking water comes from upland areas dominated by peat.

Pontesbury Gardeners' News

It's been a good start to the year with lots of people at the Trading Post on Saturday mornings. We have a good number of seed potatoes still available, and it's not too late to get them started: just lay them out in seed trays, or egg boxes, in a light, frost-free room and let the shoots develop so that they have a head start when planted out in late March and early April.

The Annual General Meeting will be held on 7 March, at 7.30pm in the Len Simpson Room of Pontesbury Public Hall, and we hope to see more Members attending. There will be refreshments available at the end of the meeting where we'll all get a chance to chat and catch up after the winter.

The Trading Post, in Station Road, is open every Saturday from 9.30 to 12 noon until the end of October.

NATURAL ENGLAND - Notes from the hill

Spring is in the air and our resident birds are now singing again in the early morning. Many birds of prey are also carrying out their courtship displays as they pair up ready for the nesting season to come.

Red kites are showing well on the Stiperstones at present, as they cruise around effortlessly on the updraft along the hill. They are superbly adapted to their life of carrion feeding, being lightly built so that they can fly without expending any energy, their angled wings and long forked tail allow them great



manouverability in the air, and their excellent eye sight allows them to spot carrion or small mammals from a great height.

Red kites have been a great british conservation success. Persecution reduced them to a few breeding pairs in central Wales. By the 1980s, the red kite was one of only three globally threatened species in the UK. Today the Welsh population has recovered to a population of 1800 breeding pairs, about 7% of the world's population.

As the weather improves and the hill dries out, we will be carrying out some controlled burning of the heather. However, one of the key reasons for burning is to reduce the amount of fuel on the hill should we have a summer wildfire, allowing it to be more easily controlled.

Our first event of the year is our annual scythe peening workshop. Sunday the 2nd of April offers the chance to get your Austrian scythe into peak condition for the coming mowing season. It will be at our workshop at Rigmoreoak starting at 10am, free of charge.

We will also be having our first open day at the cottages at Blakemoorgate since its closure during Covid lockdown. The cottages will be open on Easter Sunday from 11am to 3pm, so do drop in.

Pontesbury & Minsterley Road Verge Proposal

The area – location and background

The parish councils of Minsterley and Pontesbury, together with Pontesbury Climate Group and the unitary councillor, Nick Hignett, are developing the idea of restoring the road verge between Minsterley and Pontesbury species-rich grassland.

Restoring Shropshire's Verges Project (RSVP) and the Stepping Stones Project support this project and Shropshire Council Highways are being consulted.

The road verge in question is a c.700m stretch of the road between Minsterley and Pontesbury, mainly to the south side of the A488.

A well-used public footpath runs the entirely of the length of this verge, subdividing the verge into two strips – one immediately adjacent to the road, and often on guite a steep slope, and another, flatter section between the path and the adjacent field.

Rationale and context

Over the last 60 years, 97% of our wildflower meadows have been lost. Road verges offer a real opportunity to help reverse this and, if managed correctly, could form long, linear meadows. These would provide habitat themselves but also help to link up fragments of remaining meadow.
