The Council held its last Parish Meeting on Tuesday 11th April, due to the bank holiday. The start time is 7.30pm during summertime. The next Parish Council meeting will be held on **Tuesday 9th May 2023, at 7.30pm in the Pavilion**, once again moved due to a bank holiday.

Amy Brookes was nominated to be co-opted onto the Council and the Chairman, Councillor Duncan Fletcher, welcomed her. She will join the Council fully in May, when all the paperwork has been signed.

The Parish Council are pleased to announce that the leases for the public open space and attenuation pond, the area between Cricketers Meadow and the play area, have now been signed and exchanged. The Parish Council now own and maintain these areas.

Police officer numbers hit historic high in West Mercia

A record number of police officers, 2494 in total, are now serving in West Mercia, as officer numbers hit new highs.

Police and Crime Commissioner John Campion has supported West Mercia Police's Chief Constable to not only meet the Government's uplift target for West Mercia, but exceed it.

Your police force now has a headcount of 2494 officers, with officer numbers increasing by 508 since the PCC was first elected in 2016.

A further boost to officer numbers will happen in this financial year, with an additional 40 officers recruited to create new community crime fighting teams.

The PCC is committed to ensuring police officers are accessible and visible in your community, tackling the issues that matter to you.

From reporting a crime, anti-social behaviour or neighbourhood concerns to getting in touch with an officer, you can contact your local team online https://www.westmercia.police.uk/a/your-area/local-policing-team-contact/contact-your-local-policing-team/. Your report will be dealt with by our control room in exactly the same way whether you report it by calling <u>101</u>.

In an emergency always call <u>999</u>.





Gardening with a living soil is the hidden key to a garden filled with abundant health. Learn how to generate thriving soil life with Natural Gardener Nancy Lowe. In this workshop, you will delve into the secret world of soil micro-organisms, learning all about what these mysterious little creatures get up to and why they are so vital to the health of your garden. By the end of the morning, you will know how to recognise a healthy, living soil, how to identify plants to use for composting and plants to avoid and you will know how to create your own live compost blends for potting and seed sowing.

Pontesbury Gardeners' News

On May 18th we will be holding our annual Spring into the Garden social evening in Pontesbury Public Hall at 7.30 pm. Entrance is free, as are refreshments, but there will be a chance to contribute to a local charity in lieu of any payment. There will be plant stalls and others of general interest, all with a garden theme.

In 2024 the Government will ban the sale of peat-containing potting compost to amateur gardeners. In anticipation of this, and responding to a small demand, we have been stocking peat-free multi-purpose potting composts for the past few years. There has been an enthusiastic take-up of this among a small number of gardeners, but we have noticed a slight reduction in the amount being taken this year. We are aware that peat-free composts have a poor reputation, mainly due to the rather poor quality of some that were on the market several years ago, but we are receiving good reports on the ones that we have stocked. It is maybe worth trying some to compare with your regular multi-purpose before you are left with no choice next year.

NATURAL ENGLAND Notes from the hill

Writing this in April, we are just starting to see our migrant summer visiting birds returning. The earliest arrivals are the chiffchaffs. This small leaf warbler is one of the easiest birds to recognise by its two-note song which it is named after. It is a common bird and one that seems to be benefiting at the moment from climate change. Its number have increased significantly since the 1980s and its breeding range is moving further north. It is also



increasingly staying through the winter in the UK rather than migrating down to the Mediterranean and north-west African coast. Up here on the Stiperstones however it is a summer visitor usually arriving at the beginning of April.

The chiffchaff's arrival is followed closely by the other common leaf warbler, the willow warbler, a week or two later. The two birds are similar to look at, but the willow warbler's song is a sad one with a number of descending notes. It too has spread further north in the UK, but its population has shown a general reduction. Both these birds nest close to the ground in shrubs like bramble and deer pressure, particularly in southern England, may be having a detrimental affect on their breeding habitat.

The other leaf warbler that used to occur on the Stiperstones is the wood warbler, a brighter coloured bird with a very distinctive song, likened to a coin spinning on a glass tabletop. Unfortunately, this lovely bird is in decline in the UK, and it is now restricted largely to western oak woodlands. This warbler migrates the furthest of the three and declines may be due to loss of wintering habitat in countries like Ghana.




