The Referendum area is identical to the area which has been designated as the Pontesbury neighbourhood area. This includes the whole of Pontesbury Parish which means as well as Pontesbury, Pontesford, and Cruckton, it includes all the settlements as illustrated on the map on page 1.

- A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on Monday 21 August 2023:
- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the Referendum area; and
- his or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area.


Carer's Support Morning - Pavilion, Hall Bank, Pontesbury



two volunteers of the Daniel Adamson Preservation Society, custodians of a restored and fully operational 903 built former Manchester Ship Canal tug tender.

The Manchester Ship Canal is a magnificent feat of engineering, 36 miles long linking the birthplace of the industrial revolution, Manchester to the Mersey Estuary, allowing direct trade to world markets for both import and export of goods of all kinds loaded on ocean going ships. The talk will tell of the history of the building of the canal, the people who worked on it, the ships that sailed up it, some of the incidents that occurred and some strange visitors, all contributing to the fascinating and continuing story of this great Northwest waterway as well as the restoration of the "Danny" to it's former art deco glory.

Pontesbury Parish Council During the summer, despite there not being a full council meeting in August, work continues around the parish. The project to convert the remaining parish council streetlights to LED is at the stage where tenders are being received from specialist companies. A decision about awarding the contract will be made at the October council meeting. The conversion is necessary as the old SOX lamps are no longer manufactured and LED lanterns will result in significant savings with less electricity being used and lower maintenance costs for the lanterns. Less electricity being used will also contribute to the commitment of the parish council to reducing carbon emissions associated with running council services. During the summer, councillors and staff also started to look at prioritising work and projects for the forthcoming financial year and review the Parish Council Strategic Plan. The plan can be found on the parish council website www.pontesburyparishcouncil.org.uk. The parish council are always looking for feedback from residents on priorities for the year. The council budget and precept can then be set, so that these priorities can be achieved.

Funding available to Residents who do not have gas central heating

Funding has been made available to help retrofit the homes of residents living off-gas. Fully funded works will include insulation, heat pumps, first-time double glazing, and solar panels.

Some things to note before you submit your expression of interest:

- Grants are currently only available to 'off gas' homes properties that are not heated by mains gas.
- This is not a crisis/emergency scheme. The grant process does take time. Successful applicants will require several different assessments before measures are installed.
- Applicants must have lived in their property for a minimum of 6 months. Private tenants can apply, although your landlord will need to consent to all works and will be expected to make a financial contribution.
- Residents need to meet certain qualifying criteria, and your property will also need to meet certain criteria. All works are subject to survey and funding availability.

NATURAL ENGLAND Notes from the hill

I am beginning to see some small coveys of grouse on the hill now, so hopefully they have had a good year. Numbers have been recovering well after a very low spring count in 2021 of 7-8 calling males, to this years count of 18-20. Some other birds have already started heading south for the winter, our cuckoos will probably already be back in Africa, as they don't have to hang around to bring up their chicks, having given that duty to a foster bird instead. We are also seeing a passage of wheatears coming through the reserve on their way south.

Some of our management has been delayed due to the wet summer and we are looking forward to a dry spell to let us get the hay crop in from our meadows and to get some bracken spraying carried out. Where we can we cut bracken with mowers or scythes, but that is only possible where it grows on grassland areas. On the heath where the bracken grows over heather and bilberry bushes, spraying is our only option. Across the country bracken growth has increased in recent years likely helped along by increased nitrogen in the air and warmer winters. Both of these factors means that bracken is growing more vigorously resulting in it overtopping and shading out other vegetation and then forming a mulch of bracken litter through which nothing grows but more bracken. In response we spray the dense stands of bracken, where little else grows and all the areas that are sprayed are posted with signs.

Earl's Hill Grayling butterfly breeding success

Grayling butterflies have been in serious trouble over the last forty years in England and Wales, with a 92% decline in distribution and a 72% decline in abundance. They are now listed as nationally endangered. The Malvern Hills was one of the three remaining breeding sites in the West Midlands, but no butterflies appeared there this summer and it is feared that they have become locally extinct. The two precious remaining sites are Earls' Hill and the Bog Mines.

In July experts from Butterfly Conservation UK visited Earl's Hill and were delighted to find Graylings still here in abundance: sunbathing, dancing, displaying and laying eggs ready for next year. The experts spent a long time trying to work out just how we had been so successful at preserving their habitat.

It seems that walkers are helping! Erosion on footpaths leaves bare stone and worn grass, which the Graylings love for sunbathing, displaying and even laying their eggs.

The butterflies also need grazing pressure to keep the sward of Sheep's Fescue grass short. Our conservation grazing regime with Hill Radnor sheep and Dexter cattle seems to be ideal.

In the past (particularly just after lockdowns) we had a spate of serious dog attacks on the sheep, with horrible injuries and deaths. Thankfully, things now seem to be improving.

We hope soon to be using GPS collars and a smartphone app which will alert dog owners to the presence of the sheep and cattle. Meanwhile, please continue to keep your dogs under close control. Those sheep have an important job to do. If they stop grazing, we may lose the Graylings forever.

'The Lost Cairns of the Stiperstones'

An exciting programme of events is coming to the Stiperstones this Autumn, part of the Our Upland Commons project, a National Lottery Heritage funded initiative, supported by 25 organisations, and led by the Foundation for Common Land. It has also been made possible with grants from Esmée Fairbairn and Garfield Weston Foundations and locally the Millichope Foundation.

The unploughed soils and permanent pastures of common land, managed through long term commoning, have provided ideal conditions for the safeguarding of 3000 archaeological monuments. Stiperstones has 22 recorded Bronze Age cairns, 5 are scheduled. However, there are numerous other features on the hill, not formally identified/dated.

Starting with an introductory walk on the 30th September there will be survey days you can get involved in to identify, record and map some of the unknown cairns (15th, 16th and 23rd October). One of the important scheduled cairns is suffering some (unintended) damage from walkers taking a shortcut, and we will do some work to encourage people to stick to the path.

Led by Matt Williams of Fearn Heritage and Archaeology, booking for all these activities will be



Part of the Stiperstones National Nature Reserve is registered Common Land. Humans have been shaping and inhabiting this landscape for many 100's if not 1000's of years. Join us on a journey to locate, survey, record and protect some of the unknown historical features on the hill including cairns, squatter settlements and earthworks and learn more about them.

Starting on **Saturday 30th September** with an introductory walk across the top from the Knolls car park to Blakemoorgate, Matt Williams from Fearn Heritage and Archaeology will show you, and explain more about, this landscape's rich history. The walk starts at 10:30am and finishes at Blakemoorgate at around 12 noon for you to carry on or retrace your steps at your own pace.

There are thought to be several Bronze Age cairns in the undergrowth which are not recorded properly. Join Matt on **Sunday 15^{th} October** for a day to locate, survey and record these. On

Monday 16th October you can join Matt for a second day, when we are also planning to carry out some work to encourage walkers to stay on the main public footpath, as an unofficial short cut is damaging the edges of an important scheduled cairn and we need your help!

On **Monday 23rd October** starting at 10am at the Knolls car park, Matt will take a walk focussing on various squatter enclosures. You can come just for the walk or take part in a survey of the Tin House settlement and unrecorded features at Blakemoorgate in the afternoon.

Finally, on **Tuesday 24th October**, Matt will lead a final walk, similar to the walk that started the programme but hopefully filling in some blanks and sharing all the new information from this programme of work. All findings also will be written up in a report and shared with the various relevant authorities and on our website.




