

Pontesbury Community Vegetable Garden

"This is a garden for the community, run by the community," says Bill Sample, the garden coordinator. "Our first growing season has produced far more quality food than we imagined, and we have managed to donate 36 trays of food to the Rea Valley Food Bank so far."

I asked Bill and Phil Bradshaw, garden coordinator, what they felt the garden was all about. Here's what they thought:

- we would like it to foster a community spirit in the village
- its fun! gentle exercise with other people, tending plants for food in the fresh air
- fresh food is healthy, cheaper, nutritious and free from added on food miles and plastic wrapping
- our veg is grown without the use of peat based compost or chemicals to protect the planet and boost nature

We need more volunteers! Joining in could be a matter of ten minutes a week or half an hour a month, or any time you have to spare. There is no commitment to a regular time. This is what we need:

- People to water in dry spells
- Help with harvesting and taking food to the food bank, Wednesday afternoons
- Help for as long as you can spare on our regular work parties, Sunday afternoons, fortnightly 10am to 12pm, with a refreshment break.

No experience necessary, free training for would-be gardeners, tools provided, refreshments available Sundays. Free produce for volunteers!







Starting with GB she went for a chicken wire supported foam-free arrangement using garden plant material and showcasing GB flowers. Stocks, hydrangeas, glads, dahlias, phlox and Astrantia looked the picture of a country garden. Her Latvian red and white design, laid out ina contemporary parallel striped style as the flag was inspired by a visit to the country with young farmers, many years ago. She used a large grey pot as a base to pay homage to the Rock of Gibratar and Spain which was her first holiday with her husband. Lush greenery with white lilies/hydrangeas, green anthuriums and pink roses. Her triangular USA design reflected the flagwith stunning blue hydrangeas mixed with red roses and carnations between shooting stars of white hebe. NATURAL ENGLAND - Notes from the hill

The wet weather year has had some strange effects on the hill this year and affected our management too. There has been a lot of grass growth, but very little window of good weather so our hay fields are still awaiting their annual cut. This can be good for late flowering species such as devil's bit scabious, which is the species I am featuring this month. It would seem to have been a good year for most plants and the bracken has been growing strongly. Unfortunately, we no longer have the option of controlling it with the herbicide Asulox, so we continue to look for an alternative method and have trialled a few ideas although carrying out anything above heather and bilberry is going to be difficult.

Last month we had a good turnout of scythers over a week of scything where a lot of bracken and thistles were cut on the grassland areas of the reserve. We also managed to cut a couple of local meadows and hold a competition, with the hay going off as green hay for local meadow restoration projects.

The featured species from the twelve Stepping Stones Species Action Plans this month is the devil's bit scabious. Named due to its short rootstock, which was allegedly bitten off by the Devil because he was annoyed at the healing properties of the plant. The name scabious comes from the latin scabere, meaning to scratch from its traditional use to treat skin conditions such as scabies.

It is a late flowering plant that is found particularly in wet meadows and marshes and used to be very common in the Church Stretton area along with the butterfly that is usually associated with it, the marsh fritillary. An account from 1884 mentions a swarm of butterfly larvae in this area of countless thousands blackening the ground. Unfortunately, this butterfly is now extinct in the whole of the West Midlands.

All of the Species Action Plan species have champions and in the case of the devil's bit scabious it is the Marches Meadow Group. The group has been collecting seeds from their member's meadows with the intention of growing them on as plugs that can then be planted out into suitable sites. They are also looking to do the same with other meadow species that are restricted in their distribution and therefore unlikely to spread widely.

The last opening of the Blakemoorgate cottages this year will be on Sunday 15 September, between 11am and 3 pm.




